

RULES OF THE SPORTING EVENT

"PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027"

Saturday, April 24, 2027

ARTICLE 1 – GENERAL BACKGROUND

Face the unpredictable: the Patagonia Running Festival 2027 in Torres del Paine is much more than a race; it is a celebration of the human spirit and of nature. It is an opportunity for runners from all over the world to explore one of the most beautiful and remote corners of the planet, while challenging themselves and connecting with the global community of running enthusiasts. Get ready for an unforgettable adventure at the end of the world!

Event Name: Patagonia Running Festival

Slogan: Face The Unpredictable

Race Date: Saturday, April 24, 2027 (seventh edition)

Venue: Torres del Paine National Park, Chilean Patagonia.

Distances: 5K – 11K (11,500 m) – 21K (20,700 m) – 42K – 50K.

Participants: 700 runners.

Type of event: Running on a gravel (unpaved) vehicular road.

ARTICLE 2 – ABOUT THE COMPANY

The Massif is a company dedicated to producing events and tourism operations in Torres del Paine National Park, committed to providing high-quality services and experiences. We are proud to offer a distinctive touch in every detail of your visit. We offer transfer and expedition services to complement your adventure at this impressive destination. We recognize the natural heritage value and relevance of Torres del Paine and work to preserve it in every one of our activities.

ARTICLE 3 – REGISTRATION

Registration will be conducted exclusively online through the platform:

The registration period will begin on May 29, 2026 at 12:00 p.m. and will run until March 24, 2027, or until all available spots are filled, as spots are limited.

Registration includes:

- Runner's bib number and timing chip.
- Official event technical shirt (sublimated)*

- Technical bag (backpack).
- Bag check tag.
- Access to Torres del Paine National Park (race day).
- Surprise prizes and sponsor giveaways.
- Access to the festival and recovery area.
- Hydration and food at the Festival.
- Shuttle buses to the starting point according to the registered distance (round trip): from Plaza de Armas in Puerto Natales and/or Río Serrano Hotel + Spa.
- Finisher medal**.
- Official bandana.
- Hydration and food station.
- Restrooms along the route.
- Bag check (cloakroom) service.

* Size and model selection (men's/women's) is subject to real-time stock availability at the moment of registration. If an option is out of stock, it cannot be selected, and you must choose an available alternative to complete your registration. No shirt size changes will be permitted at any time; the information provided on the registration form will be strictly respected.

** Only for athletes who complete the race according to their registered distance.

Only one distance change will be allowed, with a final deadline of March 1, 2027; in this case, the applicant must pay any difference in the registration fee. However, the organization will withhold any difference in its favor as a penalty fee. Otherwise, distance changes will be subject to availability.

Any participant identified competing in a distance different from the one stated on their registration form will be automatically disqualified.

Event registration is non-refundable, either before or after April 24, 2027. Furthermore, it is non-transferable and may not be used for other editions of the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL or other events organized by The Massif. No refund of registration fees will be given, even if the participant, for any reason, including acts of God or force majeure, ultimately does not take part in the sporting event referred to in these rules.

Should the event be cancelled due to storms, rain, volcanic eruptions, weather, rough seas, winds, or other conditions of nature, or due to health conditions, pandemics, viruses, or other measures imposed by health authorities, the registration fee will not be refundable. The same will apply in cases of force majeure or acts of God, as established in Article 45 of the Chilean Civil Code. The event is subject to the weather conditions at the time and the health situation of the country and the region; therefore, the event may be rescheduled to any date determined by the organization and the authorities, even beyond April 24, 2027.

ARTICLE 4 – COURSE

The race route will run along the Y-150 vehicular road, an unpaved (gravel) road located within Torres del Paine National Park. For more information on the starting and finish points, please see Article 9 of these rules.



ARTICLE 5 – COMPANIONS

Runners may attend the event with companions. However, access to the festival area carries an additional cost, and companions who do not purchase this service will not be allowed to enter that area.

The companion ticket includes access to the festival area, with access to the same food and beverages provided to runners during the event.

Additionally, round-trip bus transfer service (from Puerto Natales to Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, where the finish line and festival area are located) is purchased separately, with limited spots and an additional cost.

ARTICLE 6 – CATEGORIES

The race will be organized into women's and men's categories, grouped by age range, considering the age the participant will turn by December 31 of the year the event takes place, for the 5K, 11K, 21K, 42K, and 50K distances.

- 18 to 29 years old (includes minors in the 5K, 11K, and 21K).
- 30 to 39 years old.
- 40 to 49 years old.

- 50 to 59 years old.
- 60 to 69 years old.
- 70 years and older.

On minimum ages and categories

- The minimum age to participate in the 42K and 50K distances is 18 years, turned by December 31 of the event year.
- The minimum age to participate in the 11K and 21K distances is 16 years, turned by December 31 of the event year.*
- The minimum age to participate in the 5K distance is 14 years, turned by December 31 of the event year.*

Minors must attend with their legal guardian when picking up their competitor kit. The guardian must present a simple power of attorney authorizing this and releasing liability, along with a photocopy of their ID card.

ARTICLE 7 – RACE KIT PICKUP

Kit distribution and race accreditation will take place in person over two days: Thursday, April 22, 2027, from 3:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Friday, April 23, 2027, from 10:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. These times are subject to change and confirmation by the relevant authorities, which will be communicated through the runner's guide and/or the social media accounts of @patagoniarunfest in due course. Both sessions will take place in the town of Puerto Natales and, in parallel, in Villa Serrano, according to information previously provided on the registration form. Schedules are subject to change. The location will be published in the runner's guide and PRF 2027 social media.

IMPORTANT: You must present your ID card or passport along with your Eventrid QR code. Athletes who cannot pick up their own kit must issue a simple power of attorney to authorize a third party to do so, presenting a copy of their ID card and/or passport. The organization is not responsible for lost items, missing items, and/or bib number changes affecting overall standings once the race kit has been handed over. Therefore, each runner must compete using the number officially issued to them.

The organization will not ship kits that were not picked up in person. If a participant is unable to attend the race, they must pick up their kit at the Río Serrano Hotel + Spa offices, within a maximum period of 15 calendar days to request kit pickup.

ARTICLE 8 – TRANSPORTATION

National and international athletes registered for PRF who are not located in the Magallanes Region must personally arrange their own transportation to reach the cities of Punta Arenas and/or Puerto Natales, whether by air or by land. The main reference points are Carlos Ibáñez del Campo Airport (Punta Arenas), Teniente Julio Gallardo Airfield, and the Puerto Natales Bus Terminal.

IMPORTANT: The event base will be located in Villa Serrano, at the Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, 330 km from Punta Arenas (5 hours) and 85 km from Puerto Natales (2 hours). Transportation to the starting points on event day, from Puerto Natales and Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, will be free of charge for all registered athletes. It is important to note that athletes may not travel to the starting points using their own transportation; they must use

the transportation provided by the event organization. The meeting point to board the buses will be Plaza de Armas "Arturo Prat," located on Hermann Eberhard street, where runners must present their bib number to board the bus.

Registered athletes attending with companions must inform the organization in advance so that transfer availability can be assessed.

ARTICLE 9 – STARTING POINTS

The starting points are located within Torres del Paine National Park. Per CONAF instructions, and in order to avoid congestion of light vehicles on the Park's main road, athletes may not access the starting points using their own transportation. Instead, the organization will have staff at checkpoints to supervise access.

The organization will provide restrooms, food, and hydration for athletes at the coordinates mentioned above.

Start times are subject to change and confirmation by the relevant authorities, which will be communicated through the runner's guide and/or the social media accounts of @patagoniarunfest in due course.

IMPORTANT: Due to logistical considerations, the timing system will not include a timing mat at the starting point. For this reason, start times will be adjusted based on the official starting time.

ARTICLE 10 – BAG CHECK (CLOAKROOM)

The organization will provide a bag check service at each starting point, taking into account the following considerations:

- Only bags that are properly labeled with the official event bib number will be accepted, as this provides the information needed to retrieve them at the finish line.
- The bag check bag accepted will be the same one provided with the runner's kit. To use this service, you must bring the bag to the starting point. The bag's dimensions will be approximately 45 x 65 cm.
- The organization will register athletes who choose to use the bag check service. A registration mark will be made for all those who correctly hand over their belongings to the bag check staff.
- The bag check tag will show the runner's bib number.
- Once at the finish line, the runner may claim their bag by presenting their bib number.

IMPORTANT: The organization is not responsible for the loss of valuables left outside the bag, nor for lost bags that were not registered at the start. Bags will be transported from the starting point to the finish line prior to the event's start. The organization is not responsible for loss, misplacement, or damage to equipment, clothing, or sensitive documents.

ARTICLE 11 – ROUTE

The organization will have a security team and flag marshals responsible for protecting the course and carrying out the relevant road closures. Likewise, an ambulance with a paramedic will be available, tasked with sweeping runners in case any of them are unable to continue or experience difficulties along the way.

To ensure maximum participant safety along the course, vehicles will be strategically positioned along the entire route. If assistance is needed or difficulties arise, runners may go to these vehicles. Vehicles for logistical purposes or Park access may pass through during the race; therefore, runners must stay on the right-hand side of the road at all times.

Accompaniment by external support vehicles not belonging to the organization is prohibited, as is the use of bicycles or motorcycles during the race.

It is important to note that the organization recommends participants take care of their personal health and undergo a preventive medical check-up. By agreeing to compete, runners assume all risks associated with the sporting activity.

The organization aims to minimize environmental impact as much as possible, thereby strengthening one of its core principles: the care and preservation of nature. As Torres del Paine National Park is recognized as the Eighth Wonder of the Modern World and a world-class natural destination, with an extremely variable and often unpredictable climate, we expect that in April the microclimate may surprise us with autumn conditions and possible wind gusts. In order to preserve the integrity of the natural environment, the following rules are established:

- It is strictly forbidden to leave any type of waste along the route, including paper, organic waste, gel wrappers, among others.
- Trash receptacles will be provided at each aid station and at the starting points.
- All participants must keep their waste and dispose of it in the receptacles mentioned above.

- It is mandatory to follow the route marked by the event organization. Leaving the trail may cause soil erosion in the National Park.
- In order to reduce plastic consumption, disposable items such as plates, cutlery, or cups will not be distributed along the route.

ARTICLE 12 – AID STATIONS

Along the route, there will be 6 aid stations, two of which will have restrooms. At these stations, participants will find hydration, food, and staff trained in first aid. The main purpose of these stations is to provide supplies; however, the organization is not responsible for loss or misplacement should athletes leave clothing or personal items at the aid stations.

ARTICLE 13 – FINISH LINE

The finish line will be located at the Río Serrano Hotel + Spa facilities. Upon crossing the finish line, a finisher medal will be given, which can be personalized with the runner's name. This medal will be given only to those who complete their registered distance in full.

IMPORTANT: An electronic timing mat will be placed at the finish line. Therefore, athletes must cross the finish line only once so as not to interfere with the timing record.

ARTICLE 14 – PARTICIPANT SERVICES

The organization will provide services to participants at the Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, where they may access: free showers for all runners (including towel, soap, and a hair dryer area), located outside the hotel, recovery food, restrooms, an outdoor clothing and accessories shop, hydration, medical assistance services, wifi, and a games area.

IMPORTANT: To access these services, runners must present their bib number. Designated staff will be responsible for supervising the correct use of these services.

ARTICLE 15 – OVERALL RANKING

The official classification of participants will be carried out using the electronic timing system; therefore, every runner must pass through the control point included in this system, located at the finish line, in order to be ranked. Rankings will be based on order of finish and times recorded by the team of judges in charge of event control. All participants must wear their RACE BIB NUMBER VISIBLE ON THEIR CHEST in order for their finish to be properly recorded. Those who do not wear their bib number at the start or finish of the event will NOT be eligible for the privileges granted to duly registered participants. Special and exceptional cases involving lost or missing bibs, among others, must be evaluated by the organizing committee, judges, and event director.

IMPORTANT: Start times will be manually adjusted based on the official start time.

Claims related to results, times, or other matters must be submitted with technical arguments and respect toward the organization. The team of judges and the event director will evaluate such claims and take the necessary steps

to correct or edit incorrect results. The deadline for submitting claims is set at one hour before the awards ceremony.

Runners may be disqualified if they fail to comply with the event's internal rules, do not complete the course correctly, use other means of transportation and/or assistance to gain an advantage over other runners, alter their personal information, or display unsportsmanlike conduct.

The checkpoints for the 50K, 42K, and 21K will be located at the CUTOFF POINT in the administration sector; the checkpoint for the 11K will be located at the SERRANO GATEHOUSE PASS.

IMPORTANT: Based on recommendations from the authorities, the organization will assess withdrawing runners if they exceed the cutoff times. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the organization will begin the awards ceremony as indicated in Article 16 of these rules.

ARTICLE 16 – AWARDS

Only participants who complete the full distance within the maximum time allowed (8 hours) will receive a "Patagonia Running Festival Finisher" medal.

The awards ceremony will take place on the same day as the event, starting at 4:00 p.m. During this ceremony, the top competitors will be recognized as follows: a distinctive medal will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category by distance and gender. Additionally, the top three finishers in the overall ranking — women and men — for each distance (5K, 11K, 21K, 42K, and 50K) will receive a special prize.

IMPORTANT: The organization will not mail or deliver prizes to the home address of participants who are not present at the awards venue. However, in extraordinary circumstances, the prize may be shipped to a delivery branch on a CASH ON DELIVERY basis.

ARTICLE 17 – RUNNER'S GUIDE

The runner's guide will be updated periodically with more information on how we will implement new measures to ensure all event services are delivered safely. We will announce updates to our PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027 runner's guide via email, our website, and/or social media.

ARTICLE 18 – WAIVER, RELEASE OF LIABILITY, AND INDEMNIFICATION FORM

Considering my voluntary acceptance of participation in the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027 Chile, I expressly and irrevocably declare the following:

FIRST: By means of this instrument, I bind myself to comply, unconditionally and without exception, with each and every instruction, provision, rule, and ordinance that is or becomes necessary for holding the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027 Chile event, hereinafter referred to as the "Event," and which have been or will be issued by the organizers of said competition.

SECOND: Likewise, voluntarily and irrevocably, I expressly declare, extending this declaration of will to all those I represent, whether legally or contractually: I expressly waive and release from all civil liability, including extracontractual liability, that may affect the Event organizers, from any claim, action, or petition that may be sought on account of PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027. I likewise extend this waiver specifically to The Massif, its directors, executives, administrative employees, and volunteers, as well as to sponsors, collaborators, suppliers, and any person or company connected to the Event, including The Massif and Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, the Illustrious Municipality of Torres del Paine and Puerto Natales, or any one or more of them or any of their representatives, administrators, heirs, direct family, successors, or assigns, hereinafter referred to as the "Released Parties." This waiver includes any claim for damages caused by negligence arising from my participation in the Event and its related activities. This also includes any expense for legal services that may be incurred as a result of such a claim, even if it is not valid.

THIRD: By means of this instrument, I acknowledge that I have sole responsibility for my belongings and sports equipment during the Event and its related activities.

FOURTH: I likewise declare that my physical condition and general health are compatible with competing in the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL, for which I have undergone each and every relevant medical check-up, and that I bear sole responsibility for any insufficiency, accident, or illness directly related to my health. Furthermore, I declare that I am in perfect physical and psychological condition to participate in the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL, April 2027, and that my physical condition has been verified by specialist physicians.

FIFTH: By means of this instrument, I acknowledge that participating in the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL competition entails possible dangers and risks. For this reason, I release from any liability PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027, The Massif, its directors, executives, employees, and volunteers, as well as sponsors, collaborators, suppliers, and any person or company connected to the Event, Río Serrano Hotel + Spa, and the Illustrious Municipality of Torres del Paine, from any accident or incident resulting in injury or death during the Event and its related activities.

SIXTH: In the event of injury, accident, and/or illness during the Event, I give my consent to receive necessary medical attention, which will be guided by the judgment of the specialists providing services at said Event.

SEVENTH: The organization is authorized to remove any person who fails to meet this condition and endangers the safety of other runners or themselves.

EIGHTH: By means of this instrument, I permit, in perpetuity, the free use of my name and image, before, during, and after the Event, in all types of television broadcasts, press, radio, digital platforms, streaming

broadcasts, photographs both printed and digital, etc., as they belong to the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027 Event.

NINTH: By means of this instrument, I declare that if the Event is cancelled due to storms, rain, volcanic eruptions, weather, rough seas, winds, or other conditions of nature, or due to health conditions, pandemics, viruses, or other measures imposed by health authorities, my registration fee will not be refundable. The same will apply in cases of force majeure or acts of God, as established in Article 45 of the Chilean Civil Code. The event is subject to the weather conditions at the time and the health situation of the country and the region; therefore, the event may be rescheduled to any date determined by the organization and the authorities, even beyond April 24, 2027, as stated in Article 3 of the PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL 2027 rules.

TENTH: I acknowledge that the amount paid as my registration fee is non-refundable before April 24, 2027, and my full registration fee is non-refundable after April 24, 2027. I also know and accept that my registration fee is non-transferable, and may not be used for other PATAGONIA RUNNING FESTIVAL events or other events organized by The Massif.

By registering, you accept and declare that you are aware of all the articles mentioned in these rules and approve any changes that the organization may make in order to safeguard the event. The organization reserves the right to modify these competition rules and admission to the sporting event at any time.
